

Middle and Upper Schools hear about KRMEF Foundation

On January 25, Mr. Krishna Gurung, co-founder of the The Kevin Rohan Memorial Eco Foundation (KRMEF), talked to grades 6 through 11 and to the greater school community about the Foundation's work in Nepal.

The foundation provides the under privileged, disabled and poor with an opportunity to work on an organic biodynamic farm and allows them to be productive, while enabling their children to

attend school.

KRMEF Village is trying to save the local environment by using local manpower, local waste and educating the local population about the benefits of protecting the environment. The project currently runs free health and dental camps in some schools.

KRMEF Village has begun a pilot project focused on recycling waste found in and around the city of Kathmandu and utilizing

the waste to make energy and building materials. This process gives work to many jobless, helpless and disabled individuals.

KRMEF Village already has an eco-guest house, a working organic/biodynamic garden, and a Waldorf based village school for poor children.
