The Winter Garden

As we approach the Winter Solstice, the darkest time of the year, many traditions celebrate with festivals that bring light into darkness. Lighting the Advent candles, the Chanukah candles, the Christmas tree and the Kwanzaa candles all remind us of a miracle of light-be it a lamp that stayed lit for eight days, the return of the sun, the birth of the Christmas child, or the principles for creating true community. At Waldorf Schools worldwide, we celebrate this time of year by walking the spiral pathway in the Winter Garden.

To symbolize the darkness of the winter days, the Winter Garden is lit by only one candle at the center of a spiral of green boughs. After hearing a seasonal story, each child walks the spiral to its center carrying an unlit candle. In the center an Eighth Grade Angel helps each child light his or her candle. Then the child retraces the path, placing the candle along the spiral, amid the boughs. Hidden amongst the greenery are treasures, such as crystals, stones, stars, or seashells; as the candlelight grows even stronger, these treasures begin to sparkle in the darkness.
